No 3. Runway at Munich airport

1974: MUC gets build – historical Protest starts
1998: Local Groups gather together
2005: Planing of the 3 runway starts
2012: "Bürgerentscheid" – Munich says two runways are enough.

Who was involved:

- More than 80 local groups
- More than 10 institutions of the churches
- More than 10 Environmental organisations
- All opposing parties locally and countrywide

Strategy: Keep up the pressure and mobilize a public decision.





Anti-Nuclear protest in Germany

1950 -1960: local protest starts
1970: Wyhl
1986: Wackersdorf / Tschernobyl
2011: Fukushima – Merkel states: "One cannot say it is safe any longer."

Who was involved:

- local groups
- institutions of the churches
- environmental organisations
- Green party

Strategy: Keep up the pressure until the government changes its position. We could not foresee that Fukushima would happen. We actually hoped and wished nothing like that would happen.





Big picture in 2022

- 1. The Paris Agreement on stopping climate change has been signed.
- 2. Corona is the opportunity to question public spending.
- 3. Aviation has no longer a progressive image.
- 4. The governments will have to prove progress and problem solving in order to win the next elections.

Thus a trigger for decision is welcome 2022 and the following years. Make sure the public watches when it happens. Keep the pressure up. In case you havened had enough idealism yet. – Read Saul Alinsky.
